
JAM'D CHILDREN'S NEWS by Bro Monty

Women on Mission William Booth: Soup, Soap, and Salvation

William burst into the house. "I have found my destiny!" he shouted. "I have found a place where there is so much human misery in such a small space that there is a lifetime's worth of work there for me!" Horrified by the poverty and suffering most people took for granted in industrial England, William Booth dedicated his life to bringing the gospel to the outcasts of society who would never enter a church and weren't welcome there. At age fifteen, William vowed, "God shall have all there is of William Booth," and not even resistance from the church and government, lack of financial support, or vicious attacks by angry mobs could stop him from spreading the light of the gospel through the streets of England. Today, all around the world, General William Booth's Salvation Army operates thousands of evangelistic and social service centers, changing countless lives with the love of God and the courage of their convictions.

IF THERE IS ONE IMAGE of The Salvation Army that comes immediately to the public's mind, it is that of a bell-ringing volunteer tending a Christmas kettle on a city street. The kettles were started by Salvation Army Captain Joseph McFee in December 1891. It's success encouraged other local corps to do the same, and by 1895 the kettle was used in thirty Salvation Army corps on the West Coast.

Two years later, Officer William A. McIntyre took the novel idea to Boston, but his fellow officers refused to cooperate for fear of "making spectacles of themselves." So McIntyre, his wife, and his sister set up three kettles in the heart of the city. That year the kettle effort in Boston and other locations nationwide resulted in 150,000 Christmas dinners for the needy. The kettles provide about one-third of the money used to aid over 4,500,000 persons annually at Christmas. The Christmas kettle stands as a symbol of service, a refreshing reminder amid the hoopla of Christmas that people do care for one another.

As of September 2015, the Salvation Army operates in 127 countries and provides the gospel and services in 175 different languages. Today, all around the world, General William Booth's Salvation Army operates thousands of evangelistic and social service centers, changing countless lives with the love of God and the courage of their convictions. The year 2012 marks the one hundredth anniversary of the death of William Booth (1829-1912). A few thoughts jumped out during this study; Have we found our destiny? Are we totally sold out to God? Did we burst in and declare it so others would know? Does the poverty/lostness of others break your heart? He didn't let the negative attitude of others stop him from sharing the Gospel.

Missionaries provide us insight and encouragement to reach our community "By All Means." Just maybe we need to do some bell-ringing.

What blessings January brought by way of salvation at the Nursing Home Ministries, the Bread Shed and with two youth following their profession in baptism. I just can't wait to see what Jesus will do in February.

Thank You, Church, for the can goods and the undergarments for the elementary school. We are so blessed.
