The psalmist wrote: Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise: be thankful unto Him and


bless His name (Psalm 100:4).

# Women on Mission - By All Means,





"I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings" (1 Cor. 9:22b–23 NIV).
