CCSBA Focus on Discipleship

On September 4th Rick Warren wrote the following about discipleship.

"God wants us to grow up, to know the whole truth and tell it in love — like Christ in everything" (Ephesians 4:15, The Message).

God wants you to grow up: "We are not meant to remain as children" (Ephesians 4:14, Phillips). Your heavenly Father's goal for you is to mature and develop the characteristics of Jesus Christ, living a life of love and humble service. Sadly, countless Christians grow older but never grow up. They're stuck in perpetual spiritual infancy, remaining in diapers and booties. The reason is because they never intended to grow. Spiritual growth is not automatic; it takes an intentional commitment. You must want to grow, decide to grow, make an effort to grow, and persist in growing.

Discipleship is the process of becoming like Christ, and it always begins with a decision: "Follow me and be my disciple,' Jesus said to him. So Matthew got up and followed him" (Matthew 9:9, NLT). When the first disciples chose to follow Jesus, they didn't understand all the implications of their decision. They simply responded to Jesus' invitation.

That's all you need to get started: Decide to become a disciple.

It should be clear that no church grows unless there is good discipleship. Somewhere, and at some time, the church has lost Jesus' focus of making disciples and replaced it with something else. To be sure, there are many characteristics of one who is a disciple of Jesus. They share their faith, are united and active with the church, read and study the Word at home, stand on the truths of Scripture rather than the perspectives and practices of the world, pray – in private and with great intensity, and intentionally are on the go looking for ways to make more disciples of Jesus. **BIRTHDAYS & ANNIVERSARIES**

Discipleship, cont.

In making disciples though, many believe becoming a disciple of Jesus is just a product of attending church, of occasionally reading the Bible, or of attending some kind of class/workshop. However, none of those things on their own will produce a disciple. Yet, that was Jesus' command to us – "Go and make disciples".

Warren points out very well that "spiritual growth is not automatic". So, many in our churches today remain spiritually immature, perpetually stuck in "spiritual infancy". I've heard it often said, "When I die I hope the good Lord will have mercy on me and allow me to enter Heaven." What? And that coming from someone who has been in church for 40, 50, 60 years or more. That is not just spiritual infancy, but complete spiritual uncertainty. That's not a person who has become a disciple of Jesus, in spite of spending years in church. A real disciple knows their eternity is sealed in Jesus and thus, they live like Jesus daily until their very last breath.

There is as well a cost to being Jesus' disciple. He said, "So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple." (ESV) By true discipleship – being a disciple and making disciples – the Father is glorified. "By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples." (Jn 15:8 NKJV) To make disciples, you must first be a disciple.

Decide to become a disciple!
